

DENTAL PRACTICE ACCREDITATION INFORMATION FOR PATIENTS



Dental Practice Accreditation is the process a dental practice goes through to demonstrate their ongoing commitment to improving patient safety and quality of care.

Dental Practice Accreditation is mandatory for most public dental services and voluntary for private dental practices, however your dental practice may also undertake accreditation to fulfil the requirements of 'preferred provider' agreements with health insurance providers.

ADAQ encourages all members to have their practices accredited and a and a significant number already have.



WHAT ARE THE NATIONAL SAFETY AND QUALITY HEALTH SERVICES STANDARDS?

The National Safety and Quality Health Service (NSQHS) Standards provide a nationally consistent statement of the level of care consumers can expect from health service organisations. These standards exist to protect the public from harm and aim to improve the quality of health services provided.

STANDARDS OF DENTAL PRACTICE ACCREDITATION

To achieve accreditation a dental practice must meet the first six of the ten National Safety and Quality Health Service (NSQHS) Standards
